

At the January 2020 FSC Governing Board meeting, the Governing Board approved the 2020 Budget as was outlined at our Annual Meeting in November 2019. The 2020 Budget presented last November and passed by the Governing Board was scaled back significantly from previous years with the hope that we would meet and then exceed our goals, however, we are still short of the scaled back budgeted amount for pledges income.

As a Governing Board, we are working hard with phone calls, emails and one-on-one meetings to get everyone's pledge in. Paul Arnold and the Stewardship Committee have been working very hard for "funRaising" success so we can continue with the programming we currently have and then expand upon. FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER



There is a reason February is short - it makes winter feel shorter. Groundhog Day is at the beginning, which just happens to be at the midpoint of the season, about seven weeks after the winter solstice and almost seven before the spring equinox. So, when the groundhog says, 'six more weeks of winter,' it's the same as saying 2+2=4.

Trivia aside, I said these last four Chimes articles would be about the four qualities I believe you should seek in my successor. The first was transparency, that a good spiritual leader is as honest as possible with the people they served.

The second is accountability, which broadly means taking responsibility. To be accountable means telling folks what you mean, meaning what you say, making commitments and following through. The opposite is often easier to see. Leaders who are vague in their words, who do not follow their own advice, who excuse their errors by blaming others, are avoiding responsibility. They are, ultimately, not not leaders because they do not want to be tied to those they serve.

And that's the key to being a leader. No matter how visionary, charismatic, or brilliant, she or he is only a leader if they are connected to the lives of those they have been asked to lead. That's why it is 'followers' who choose leaders. Sometime this year you will be asked to elect a president, a senator, a member of Congress, and a new spiritual leader.

They cannot become those things unless we choose them.

Anyone can be visionary alone, charismatic on Youtube, or brilliant on paper. To be a leader means being accountable to those who choose you to lead. If there is a long-time problem with our national government it is that even those we elect seem not to care about those who cast those ballots. They are accountable to others: funders, parties, ideologies.

Both this church and this nation need their people to realize their responsibility, which is to choose people who will be transparent and accountable to them. It takes vision on your part, to look beyond the immediately appealing aspects of a candidate and sense whether they are being transparent about who they are and what they say. It takes intelligence on your part to discern if a candidate is truly accountable, understand responsibility, and will honor it.

I trust the search committee to do the very best job they can, and they have been working on it for a long time already. It is now time for you, the members of the church, to prepare to do your part. Talk with each other about what really matters to you. Listen to what others say. Are you being honest with others and yourself about what matters to you here at FSC?

Maybe transparency and accountability are not just for ministers! -WFW-

BECOMING ANTI-RACIST, UNLEARNING WHITE SUPREMACY

One of the time-honored traditions of Fountain Street Church is that we don't shy away from life's difficult issues. In fact, we prefer to tackle them head-on.

In January we began in Chapel a deeper discussion of racism and white supremacy. It was not a perfect discussion. It was not a complete discussion.

And that's part the point. Too often folks don't enter these discussion out of fear or guilt or simply not knowing. Yet the door must be open to sometimes create safe space and to sometimes create brave space, where we can speak and say what we need to - and hear what we need to, especially when it's challenging.

As a largely white institution which operates in white ways, we must first be educating ourselves. Second, we must engage in a mutual partnership with others so that we might be changed. Third, we must change in response to those partnerships.

We began this conversation and we will continue it. With February being Black History month, I encourage you to pick up a book, watch a movie, or follow a blog that will teach you more about racism and white supremacy. Let it break your heart.

Then let it move you. Take some action to deliberately put yourself in spaces where you are making relationships across the spectrum of skin colors. Support Black and minority-owned businesses. Go to places where you are in the minority. Be attentive to the richness there and the pain. Know that you won't be perfect and that's okay.

Each of us doing our own parts will lead us toward that dream that the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is so famous for. We will become a richer tapestry, a more colorful community. And we will all be better for it.

It will take practice. Help is available. If creating the life of deeper meaning and greater value your heart desires appeals to you, join us at 9:30AM in the Chapel every Sunday. We hope to see you there!


COME SING WITH US!

He was Artist in Residence at the Byron Center Fine Arts Center in 2018 and the Forest Hills Fine Arts Center in 2019.





approximately 50 products each visit; From dish soap, to rice, beef stew, crackers, and yes, also soup. In fact, almost always **soup**.



SENIOR MINISTER SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

These are exciting, but stress-inducing times for Fountain Street Church. We ask for your patience and continued support while we continue to search for a candidate worthy of this congregation.

Here's where we are right now:

The Search Committee has reviewed more than a dozen applications from qualified candidates. We selected a small number of semi-finalists and are interviewing them now, using FSC's new video conferencing system.

The next step will be to select finalists to meet with the committee face-to-face. Because they may have applied to other churches as well as Fountain Street, we cannot predict how they will respond. Please understand that, out of respect for the candidates and for our process, we must maintain confidentiality during this time.

In the meantime, the Governing Board has been exercising due diligence and is preparing for the possibility that the right candidate may not be found at this time. In that case, an interim, or temporary, minister would be hired and the SMSC would continue to do its work.

Connections Returns for Winter 2020

Leading by Heart: re-discovering your courage at Fountain Street Church

For the past two years, Connections Circles have been meeting for 4-week sessions around the theme of "Change" - examining our fears and resistance to change as well as our strategies for whole-heartedly embracing change. This Winter, as we head into yet another transition phase with new church leadership on the horizon, we offer two sets of 4-week Connections series with a particular focus on leadership.

Using Brene Brown's book, Dare to Lead we will:

- discover, explore and re-define what makes a good leader
- discover our own leadership qualities in a Connections setting
- discover another way to be intentional in community

What is Connections? Intentional small groups of 6 to 8 people who meet to experience a new way of speaking and listening to each other, creating the time and space for deeper and better conversation.

As part of the Learning Commons, the "Leading by Heart" sessions are offered on Sundays from 10:45AM-12:30PM and on Tuesday mornings from 9:30-11AM on the following dates:

- Session One: Sundays Feb 2, 9, 16, 23 and again on March 1, 8, 15, 22.
- Session Two: Tuesdays Feb 4, 11, 18, 25 and again on March 3, 10, 17, 24

We encourage choosing either Sunday or Tuesday; the material covered will be the same for both, but staying with and getting to know the same group of folks is the real benefit. For an 8-week experience, participants are welcome to take both the February and the March gatherings. We will be using experiential exercises in addition to "circle process," the heart of Connections.

Support the Church, Reduce Your Tax Bill

If you are age 70 1/2 or older and have an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you may qualify for a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). Once a person turns age 70 1/2, the IRS requires a minimum amount be withdrawn from their IRA each year -- this Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) is taxable as ordinary income. However, eligible charitablyminded members and friends of FSC may elect to have all or a portion of their RMD sent directly to FSC (as an annual pledge to support ongoing operations or to support the Fountain Street Foundation). This direct charitable contribution from your IRA to the Church or any other charitable cause may lead to reduced taxes.
